DETERMINATION LETTER

Chair Gary Woodward read the Determination Letter in accordance with Utah Code 52-4-207(4) of the Utah Open and Public Meeting Act that states according to the COVID-19 pandemic, the meeting may be held electronically.

ARBOR MONTH DISCUSSION

Scott Zeidler reported he did the Tree Tour on the Tree Board webpage, along with the descriptions of the trees that Gary Smith provided. He said the GIS Department did a great job of putting the Tree Tour together. Chair Gary Woodward said he would like to continue to have tree tours during the entire month of May in the future. Joy Chambers reported she placed the tree stickers at City Hall. Scott Zeidler suggested doing tree tours at designated parks or even the cemetery where there are older, established trees.

Anne Linton placed a flyer on the City webpage that discusses the activities that are taking place during Arbor Month. Jennifer Hansen, Deputy Recorder, also put a link in the City Newsletter for Arbor Month. Grant Chavez suggested if the Boy Scouts in the area start meeting in the future, it would be great to have them involved in Arbor Month next year.

WEBPAGE UPDATE

Chair Gary Woodward reported he talked with Lisa Romney, City Attorney, about the possibility of adding the Tree City PDFs to the City webpage. Lisa Romney feels it would be great to add the links, but actual copies can be on the webpage as well. Gary Woodward said since it is Arbor month, he will not post the PDFs at this time. The descriptions of trees from Trees USA could be posted along with pictures of the trees.

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The Tree Board agreed to have the pictures on the webpage remain that Gary Smith has already posted that were from J & L Garden Center. Gary Woodward will go through Gary Smith's documents and the pictures from Tree City USA to see what pictures should be posted.

Scott Zeidler reported Utah State University frequently posts items on their agriculture webpage. They are currently featuring Nesting Blue Bees. A link could be posted for the USU agriculture webpage that includes what bugs to look for in the garden and trees, and how to remove them. Scott will contact Mary at Utah State University to ask permission to post her link on the Tree Board webpage.

REVIEW TREE LIST ADDITIONS

Chair Woodward reported he received an email from Lisa Romney, City Attorney, that was also addressed to the City Council regarding the first phase of changes being considered for parking strips. Gary also talked with Brant Hansen, City Planner, who has been working on changes for the City Council that apply to the City Ordinance. The email stated that at this time, there has not been any authorization for hardscaping or changes to trees in park strips. There has been discussion of allowing loose gravel and rocks that are one-inch in size, but pavers that are permanently cemented or mulch will not be allowed in park strips. Utility workers need to have access to covers, and mulch in park strips could get into the storm drain system and cause problems. Grant Chaves said he has noticed grass clippings are blown into the street which can also clog the drain system when it rains. Trees in parking strips will be discussed in the future.

Scott Zeidler suggested that when tree park strip changes are made, that a "Tree of the Month" in Centerville be added to the Tree Board website. This would include a description of the tree and where it is located so that citizens could go see it. Gary Woodward would like to have a Facebook page for the Tree Board, and an article in the City Newsletter that would allow residents to nominate a tree in their yard.

Joy Chambers suggested a policy be made to encourage citizens to replace trees that are lost in windstorms, along with a policy on where they can be placed. In some cities, there are penalties for people who take trees down. Scott Zeidler said the Utah Division of Forestry and State Lands has a small fund of money where communities can submit for a grant that could be considered towards mitigation from trees lost due to windstorms on public property. This is a reimbursed grant after the cities have spent the money for the trees. Scott also suggested an award for citizens to prune their trees so that they would be less likely to brake in a storm. Bruce Cox or Mike Higgins will be asked to attend the next meeting to discuss this idea. Chair Gary Woodward will contact Bill Ince, City Council Liaison, to also attend the next meeting.

Chair Gary Woodward reported he talked with Mayor Wilkinson about additions to the tree list, and the Mayor said he will discuss it with the City Council. He feels the tree list Gary Smith made will be added to the City Council agenda for consideration for the Ordinance.
