DOG WASTE DISCUSSION

Sherrae Phelps reported she sent an email to Mayor Wilkinson about her concerns with dog waste on the trails in the mountains. She would like to have dog waste stations installed at the Parrish Canyon trailhead, and at the three large rocks near the road that connects to the trail. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, explained the City Council would need to authorize a city employee to maintain the dog waste cans or dumpster. The city currently spends \$12,000 a year on the purchase of dog waste bags for the parks in Centerville. Al Phelps said he would be willing to check and empty the cans once a month to see if people are using them.

At 8:23 p.m., Chair Mikael Remington arrived at the meeting.

MONTHLY TRAIL MAINTENANCE

 Sherrae Phelps said she would like to do maintenance on the Sunset Trail and reroute it so it does not go straight up. Al Phelps said he is willing to volunteer to make three switchback turns on this trail. The direction of the trail will not be changed, but the changes will make it easier to walk on. This trail is on Forest Service property, and a permit must be obtained from the Forest Service to do the changes. Former Trails Committee member, Rick Turner, has had trail training from the Forest Service, and he could be used as an advisor for this project. This item will be posted on the city website and the Trails Committee Facebook to schedule a day for volunteers in Centerville to help with trail maintenance.

MULTIPLE SELF-PROMOTED TRAIL CREWS

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported there have been multiple "cowboy trail builders" that make their own trails, and then other people come and make changes to the trails. The Trails Committee needs to bring these people who are making their own trails and unite them into one group to work together to make trails. Sherrae Phelps suggested contacting home owners to place signage on their property to keep people on the trails, or assign a trail chief to keep people on the trails.

CONNECTING TRAILS

Sherrae Phelps made a **motion** to make the Parrish Trail connect to the Deuel Creek Trail, and the Zig Zag Trail an official trail with signage to be called the Wagon Wheel Trail. Jamison Pexton seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

PROPOSED BIKE AND TRAIL SYSTEM

 Chair Mikael Remington reported he talked with Mayor Wilkinson regarding trail grants. The city must be willing to provide matching money when a trail grant is given, and there must be a guarantee the trail will be maintained. Currently, the State is focusing on grants for outdoor activities, such as walking and bike trails.

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, said there is currently a push to try and get Forest Service property deeded for a cemetery. There are other cities that are looking at this idea to get more cemetery property. There will be a bond on the November ballot to purchase land for a cemetery.

MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the April 15, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Sherrae Phelps made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

The next Trails Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, June 17, 2021 at 8:00 p.m. at Island View Park.
